### Admission Requirements

First Time College Students: Admission to UMKC is all that is required for students applying to the Bachelor of Health Sciences as first time college students. There is no separate application process for the BHS.

The UMKC BHS Degree Program is the perfect choice for students who are interested in a career in health focusing on health prevention, health promotion, population health, and health behavior change. UMKC is offering the new BHS Degree in response to the growing workforce demand for health professionals in a variety of areas including, personal health and wellness, social determinants of health, occupational health and safety, community health, and environmental health. Graduates may find career options in government settings, non-for profit organizations, community health centers, workplace health and wellness companies, and health promotion organizations.

Coursework, service learning, and internships in the BHS program will provide students with the knowledge and practical experience to compete in the job market. Students interested in careers in health education, health promotion, health marketing or journalism, or specialized business careers will be particularly well-prepared with a Bachelor of Health Sciences degree. Some career paths may include: Non-profit Organization Administrator, Hospital Community Outreach Manager, Nutrition Educator, Client/Patient Advocate, Wellness Coordinator, Community Relations Coordinator, Pharmaceutical Salesperson, Community Health Educator, Health Educator, Emergency Management Coordinator, or a career in a number of other areas.
