
## SCONHS PROFESSORS OF THE YEAR

## SCIENTIST OF THE MONTH

"What's new and exciting about your research?"

While I have several federally-funded large-scale projects underway, I find the small internally funded project to be one

of my most fun projects right now. I have a small-scale yearlong project exploring the impacts of a free bike share membership on UMKC students' social determinants of health that is funded through the UMKC FFE mechanism. In this study, 150 students could opt into receiving a 1-year bike share membership that provides them with 80 minutes of free ride time per day on e-bikes that are distributed throughout the city. When opting for a bike share membership, students provided consent for researchers to access trip related data (i.e. start and end time and GPS coordinates). An additional 125 students opted into a control group by selecting a \$10 gift card. Participants in the intervention group were primarily male (53.3%) and Asian (46.7%) and had a mean age of 21.8 years (SD=4.7), where control group participants were majority female and a mean age of 18.3 years. At 6 months 2,001 trips were taken and 38.7% of students in the intervention group had taken ≥1 trip. Mean trips per student are 38.7, ranging from 1 to 191 trips. Mean trip duration was 12 minutes and 22 seconds and ranged from 20 seconds to 1 hour and 54 minutes. Initial analyses reveals bike share to be a valuable resource for a subsample of the intervention group, with some students using the bike more than once per day on average. The data also indicate gender disparities in the propensity to bicycle continue to exist with fewer females opting into a bike share membership. Considering the adoption rate for students opting into the intervention group, future studies should implement educational classes or resources and messaging to promote use.

I look forward to future phases of this research that will include analyses to identify predictors of bike share use, of health metrics, and analyses of trip destinations using start point and end point GPS coordinates.
